PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

Selichot –Saturday, September 16

This evening marks the beginning of the High Holy Days. Traditionally, Jews gather late at night on the Saturday before Rosh HaShanah to prepare for the Days of Awe. The late hour and themes articulated in the liturgy begin to set the tone for the days ahead. Together we shall prepare our hearts and minds. Please join us for our Selichot Program at 8:00 p.m., prior to the 10:00 p.m. Service.

Rosh HaShanah – Wednesday & Thursday September 20 & 21

Literally means “Head of the Year” and refers to the beginning of a new Jewish year. It provides an opportunity for each of us to reflect upon our actions of the preceding year.

Adventure in the Park – Thursday, September 21

This High Holy Days Service is offered in the casual setting of a neighborhood park, complete with apples & honey and crafts for the kids. Each family brings their own picnic lunch. This Service is perfect for families with babies and children up to 13 years of age - of course grandparents and older kids are welcome too! This Service will take place in El Dorado Park, Willow Grove Reserved Picnic Site.

Tashlich, Belmont Pier – Thursday, September 21

We traditionally walk to the ocean and throw bread crumbs into the water to symbolically cast our sins away. Micah 7:19 - “God will have compassion upon us; God will subdue our iniquities and will cast (Tashlich) all their sins into the depths of the sea.” Metaphorically, as the eyes of the fish never close, so God always watches for our sins to be cast away. Meet at Belmont Pier, Ocean at 39th Place.

Shabbat Shuvah – Friday & Saturday, September 22 & 23

The Sabbath of Return (to God) following Rosh HaShanah includes prayers unique to the High Holy Days season and offer a time of reflection prior to Yom Kippur.

Kol Nidre – Friday, September 29

Kol Nidre means “all vows.” This solemn prayer is chanted at the beginning of the Yom Kippur Evening Service. It is a time to “let all vows, oaths, and promises that we make to you, O God, between this Yom Kippur and the next, be excused should we, after honest effort, find ourselves unable to fulfill them.”

Yom Kippur Day – Saturday, September 30

The Day of Atonement is considered the holiest of days on the Jewish calendar. This is the time when we traditionally ask for forgiveness for our transgressions during the past year, and to be sealed in the Book of Life for the ensuing year.

Yom Kippur Forums – Saturday, September 30

Facilitated topical group discussions about current social issues viewed from a Jewish perspective, led by our members.

Sukkot – Wednesday & Thursday, October 4 & 5 Torah Center Sukkot Celebration - Wed. October 4 followed by Sukkot Dinner

During this “Festival of Booths,” we commemorate the safe passage made by the Israelites through the desert and also give thanks for a plentiful fall harvest.

Simchat Torah – Wednesday & Thursday, October 11 & 12

This is the joyous festival when we “rejoice in the Torah.” During the Service, we read the last section of the Book of Deuteronomy and the beginning of the Book of Genesis as an affirmation of our commitment to celebrate and learn Torah. Yizkor will be recited at the Thursday Morning Service.



IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Sanctuary Etiquette

There is no reserved seating. Congregants, upon their arrival, may save seats for family members until Services begin. Please respect the sanctity of our Services by not chewing gum, and by turning off cell phones and electronic devices.

High Holy Days Dress Code

We suggest that men wear long pants and a dress shirt. Jackets or suits are preferred but not required. We suggest that women wear skirts, dresses, or dress pants. No bare shoulders, midriffs, or very short skirts, please. Thank you for maintaining a high level of sanctity and appropriateness at Services.

Yizkor Memorial Book

We will distribute a Memorial Book on Yom Kippur. This is an opportunity to memorialize beloved family and friends who are no longer with us.

Mishebeirach List

Names of friends and loved ones who are ill can be placed on our Mishebeirach List, which will be read during Services. Please submit names in advance, by calling the Temple Office at (562) 434-0996.

Special Needs

Devices for the hearing impaired and large print prayer books will be available upon request. Ask an usher when you arrive.

HIGH HOLY DAYS ADMISSION TICKETS

(For your security, tickets will be checked upon entrance)

Admission tickets will be provided for adult members in good standing and their children who are under age 25 (admission tickets will not be needed for minor children). We strongly encourage families to worship together, but we must be prudent in offering tickets to extended family members. Therefore the following guidelines will be employed:

1. **Members** of the Temple *in good standing* will receive admission tickets. Each family membership will receive **two admission tickets**. Single memberships will receive **one admission ticket**. In good standing requires that all obligations are current through the end of the month preceding the High Holy Days. *(This, in accordance with Article III, Section 1D of the bylaws, passed May 1995)*
2. **Adult children ages 25 and over** may attend High Holy Days Services with their families at the cost of \$100 per person. This may be applied to membership should they choose to join the Temple.
3. **Out-of-town relatives** visiting Temple members may attend High Holy Days Services, at the cost of \$175 per person or they may attend at no cost, if their 'home' Temple forwards a Letter of Reciprocity to us on their behalf.
4. **Non-affiliated guests** who would like to attend our Services may do so for \$400 per person. If non-affiliated individuals choose to join our Temple within the fiscal year, the amount paid for admission tickets can be credited toward their annual contribution.
5. **Undergraduate college students and military personnel on active duty** will be given free admission tickets upon request, with proper identification.
